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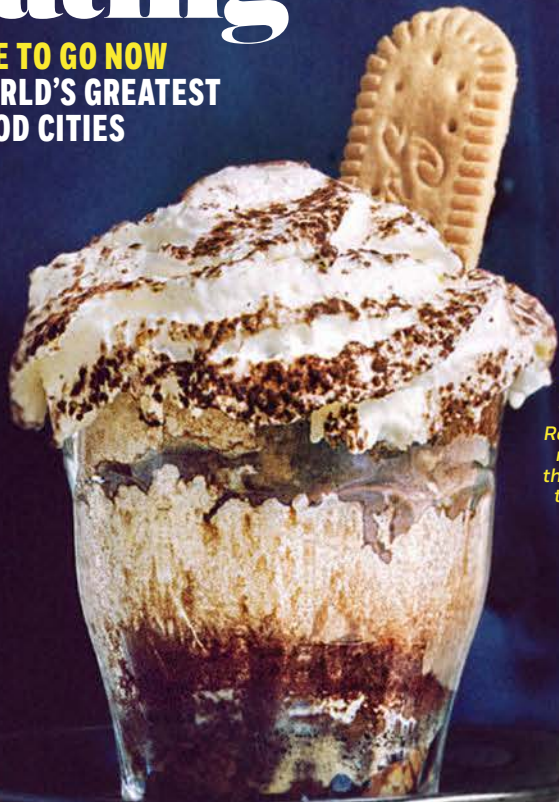

The Durham
DURHAM, NORTH CAROLINA

The Hotel
Commune, the design team behind the Ace Hotels in L.A. and Palm Springs, gave the property a retro look in a nod to its home in a 1969 bank building.

The Menu
James Beard winner Andrea Reusing serves such regional classics as biscuits with ham, corn

muffins with house preserved blueberries, and buckwheat sugar cakes.

Thompson
CHICAGO

The Hotel
Dark velvet, exposed brick, and polished wood dominate the industrial look of this Gold Coast hotel. Quirky art hangs on the walls of the 247 rooms, which face Lake

Michigan and the Magnificent Mile.

The Menu
The hotel's Nico Osteria, known for Italian seafood dishes, just upped its breakfast game. Apple pancakes are topped with sweet cream and honey, and omelets are served with gnocchi.

Soho House
ISTANBUL

The Hotel
This former 19th-century palace is now an 87-room hotel in the happening Beyoğlu district. Original marble fireplaces and frescoes anchor the public spaces; guest rooms are decorated with kilim rugs, leather armchairs, and stand-alone tubs.

The Menu
Turkish specialties include *sucuk* sausage, *menemen* (scrambled eggs with feta, tomatoes, and peppers), and the Istanbul Breakfast, a smorgasbord of olives, thyme-infused cheese, and pepper jams.

A block from the beach, the hotel has a breezy, whimsical style. Inside the 40 rooms: canary-yellow sofas, wool carpets with black-and-white geometric patterns, antiques, and oversize four-poster beds.

The traditional



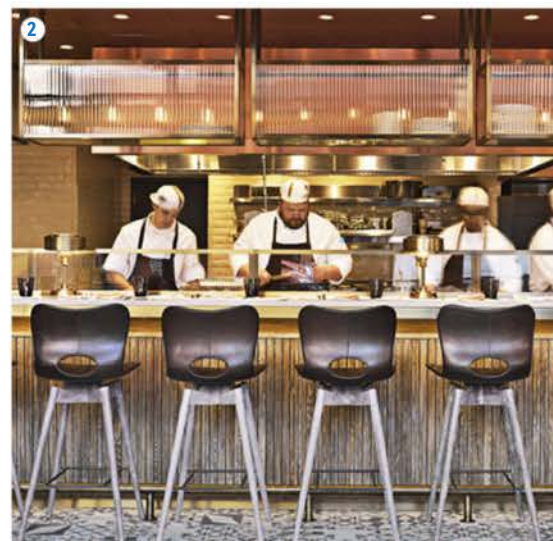
Israeli breakfast is a fortifying spread of meze: smoked salmon, labneh, hummus, and Emmental cheese.

Mandarin Oriental
MARRAKECH

The Hotel
On 50 manicured acres, 63 villas and suites are modeled after Moroccan riads, with intricately carved walls and marble hammams clustered around elegant courtyards shaded by fig and apricot trees.
The Menu
Khlie tagine is made with marinated beef and fried eggs, and square *msamen* pancakes come with organic Moroccan honey.

Reverie Saigon
HO CHI MINH CITY, VIETNAM

The Hotel
Prominent Italian designers such as Poltrona Frau and Giorgetti designed the 286 guest rooms in this opulent new hotel with crystal chandeliers, mosaic-tiled bathrooms, and sprawling city views through the floor-to-ceiling windows.
The Menu
Café Cardinal, lined with massive columns, sets the scene for made-to-order Vietnamese classics such as chili- and basil-scented noodle soup and slow-braised stew, served with a crispy baguette on the side.
